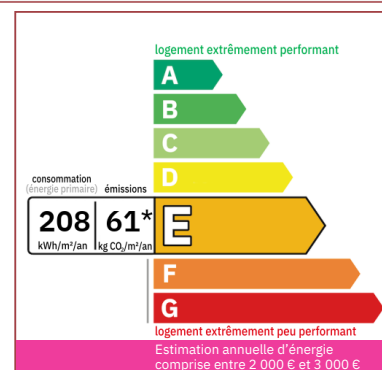

A unique opportunity to purchase a stone property in a bucolic setting.

The airport and town of Bergerac is approx 40 minutes and about 1 1/2 hours from Bordeaux benefitting from international flights.

This charming stone property is approx 6 kms from the charming small town of Lauzun with shops and restaurants and 13 kms from the vibrant bastide village of Eymet.

There is a Montessori school located in Lougratte 10 minutes drive.

The property enjoys a secluded private and tranquil setting, nestled in the surrounding valley and at walking distance a lake and woodland offering a variety of walks and bike rides.

The house is served by its own private driveway at the end of a lane with surrounding orchards and fields

The house, which dates back to 19th century and has open views across the valley to the woods and hill beyond the lake. (The lake itself cannot be seen from the house ) A large barn and old farm buildings, which include a cowshed/ workshop, two store rooms, a pigeonier and a bread oven, form the courtyard's west side. The pool-house and an artists studio are along its east side. The buildings have stone walls under canal-tiled roofs. The Courtyard features two covered au-vents for parking, the well, an ancient millstone, plus a mixture of lawns, mature trees and shrubs.

The covered terrace (6.56 x 3;54m) facing east onto the main garden to ponds, fields and woods and southwards, with oak beams, and benefiting from a tiled floor. Entry into the kitchen through glazed french door.

There is another open east-facing terrace (4.63 x 3.54 metres) which has tiled paving and access to the lawn in the north garden and to the main bedroom through another double glazed door.

There is a secondary, north-facing open terrace outside the corner of the house with paved surface and paved access from the courtyard and along the side of the house.
